Spelling Success: Mastering Our Spelling List

Objective: Students will be able to correctly spell and use 10 new vocabulary words in context.

Assessment:

Students will complete a spelling quiz at the end of the lesson, where they will be required to spell each of the 10 vocabulary words correctly and write a sentence using 5 of them.

Key Points:

- **Vocabulary Words:** Introduce the list of 10 new spelling words (e.g., beautiful, necessary, favorite, etc.).

 - o "What sound does the 'ea' in 'beautiful' make?"

Independent Practice:

- Students will complete a spelling worksheet where they will:
 - Write each of the 10 vocabulary words correctly.
 - O Use 5 of the words in their own sentences.
- Set clear expectations for quiet work time and encourage students to raise their hands if they need help.

Closing:

- Have students share one word from the spelling list with a partner and use it in a sentence.
- Ask a few students to share their sentences with the class to reinforce learning.

Extension Activity:

• For students who finish early, provide a word scramble or crossword puzzle using the spelling words for additional practice.

Homework:

 Assign students to create a short story or paragraph using at least 7 of the spelling words. They should underline the spelling words in their writing.
